

We hope you enjoy the campground and day use areas of Wakamow Valley

This information is intended as a general guide to camping in
Wakamow Valley's River Park Campground

- Please register at the campground office. Check-in time is 2:00pm.
- **Checkout time is 12:00pm. Please dispose of all garbage when leaving in receptacles provided.**
- Camping fees are payable upon registration to the date of departure. For long term campers a minimum of one week in advance must be paid.
- Reservation fee are not refundable; first night camping fee is refundable less a \$10 administrative charge.
- Camping fees are not transferrable.
- The maximum number of motor vehicles, tents and recreational vehicles and trailers permitted on one campsite is three, of which only two may be used as sleeping quarters. A screen room is permitted and should not be used as an accommodation unit.
- The camping fee applies to each accommodation unit on a campsite, unless the second accommodation unit is a tent and there is only one motor vehicle registered to the site.
- No more than six people may occupy a campsite unless they are all members of the same family unit.
- Camping permit holders are responsible for the actions of all camping party members and any visitors to their campsites. Visitors must park in the Kiwanis River Park parking lot only, located across the road.
- Liquid and solid waste (grey and black water) must be disposed of at the dumping station only.
- Campsites must be kept well-ordered at all times; do not encroach on another campsite.
- Washing RV units is not permitted in campsites.
- When using campground washroom facilities please do not leave a mess; be considerate of the next user.
- Help yourself and other campers to enjoy the peace and tranquility of our campground by avoiding excessive noise. Loud partying, loud music and other rowdy behavior will not be tolerated at any time; Campers may be asked to leave the campground by campground host at any time in case of disruption or violations.
- **Quiet hours are in effect from 11:00p.m. until 7:00a.m.**
- Please drive cautiously and obey all speed limits – children may be playing in the area and campground roads are often used as pathways and for riding bicycles.
- To prevent damage to trees and other vegetation, please keep all vehicles on designated roadways.
- To protect your pet, wildlife and other campers please keep your pet on a leash during your stay
- **Please pick up after your pet.**
- Be considerate of other campers – please ensure that your dog doesn't bark excessively.
- The consumption of liquor and recreational marijuana is restricted to registered campsites only.
- Use of fireworks is prohibited in City of Moose Jaw's city limits.
- For your safety and to protect wildlife do not approach, feed or harass wild animals – these actions may cause a wild animal to feel threatened and a threatened wild animal can pose a danger to humans and/or their pets.
- Store food (including pet food) and toilet articles such as soap and toothpaste in the trunk of your vehicle or RV unit – never take these items into your tent or tent trailer. Seal garbage in plastic bags and dispose in containers provided.
- To protect the natural beauty of our parks it is illegal to remove, deface, injure or destroy plants. Only use untreated wood for fires; firewood is available for sale at the campground office.
- Fires are permitted only in park supplied fire pits or approved fire appliances; fires must not be left unattended or left to burn overnight. Extinguish fire prior to retiring for the evening.
- Wakamow Valley's River Park Campground experiences very little serious crime; with your cooperation we can keep it that way – ensure that your camping gear and valuables are securely stored and locked up when you are away from your site; to deter thieves, mark your camping gear and valuables; report acts of vandalism to the campground office; be a good neighbour – help protect one another's property.
